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### Full Time Classes Begin

Paths to Independence has now started serving full-time students. Starting Monday, November 5th, PTI implemented a full-time private school program for students with autism spectrum disorders from preK to 12th grade. Students participate in a structured teaching program designed to meet their individual needs. We are using the ABA program, Rethink Autism, to track and document skill growth. In addition, students will be introduced to appropriate material for their grade level in a manner consistent with their individual learning needs. Our nonverbal students are being taught to communicate with the Picture Exchange Communication System. We are excited to already see excellent growth in communication skills using this system. PTI's school program follows the Bartlesville Public School calendar and is open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. In addition, we will continue to offer an after-school program from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. and full day programming during most school breaks.





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#### **Fall Break Activities**

Fall Break was a busy time for PTI. We remained open on October 17th, 18th, and 19th while the public schools were closed. Students had fun swimming at the Owasso YMCA, walking and bike riding on the Pathfinder, and riding horseback with Bob. In addition, everyone stayed busy learning new games, playing on the playground, and reading. PTI was also open on October 26th, while elementary children were out for conferences. We were fortunate that the Fairfield Inn let us use their pool to swim that day. Thank you to Fairfield's manager, Cindy Robinson, for allowing us that privilege. In order to meet DHS licensing guidelines, we have hired a lifeguard to supervise our swimming fun. Welcome Josh Weatherly, who gave up three days to take the lifeguard training for us at the YMCA.



### PTI Fun Nights for High School and Adult Students

In October and November, PTI joined with Tri County Tech to provide a cooking class for high school students and adults with autism. In December, we will be offering a time for high school students and adults to hang out and enjoy social activities together. Project Lifesaver International is a 501(C)(3) non-profit organization that bridges the technological gap for "at risk" populations and public safety agencies. It provides police, fire/rescue and other first responders with a comprehensive program including equipment and training to quickly locate and rescue "at risk" individuals with cognitive disorders who are at constant risk to the life threatening behavior of wandering including those with Alzheimer's disease, Autism, and Down syndrome.
